Happy Thanksgiving to all! Thanks to those brother knights and their wives who were at the Florida Respect Life Conference in Tampa and attended our "Meet and Greet" meeting. We were encouraged to see so many of you at the conference. We need this kind of support promote the State Council Knights of Columbus Pro-Life agenda.

The 40 Days For Life Prayer and Fasting Campaign has come to a successful close. On Sunday evening 10/28/07 we were part of a national conference call with leaders of the campaign.

There were several positive comments from: Fr. Frank Pavone, Dr. Alveda King, David Bereit and many local campaign coordinators. Some of the results have been that over 300 lives were spared. The people of Uganda were praying for the success of the 40 Days For Life Campaign in America. Anywhere from dozens to thousands of people got involved at each of the over 80 cities in 33 states. It is estimated that hundreds of thousands participated and many for the first time got involved. Planned Parenthood is anxiously waiting for the 40 Days For Life campaign to end. It is drastically cutting into their abortion business. In some cities if the Pro-Life people continue their vigils Planned Parenthood abortion mills will be forced to shut down. We have taken the battle to the streets and God is working His miracles.

#### In Case of Death

At the death of a Brother Knight, notify the Grand Knight or the next in charge, who will then contact the family and offer sympathy and help from the Council. The Council member contacting the family should ask whether a wake will be held and if so, whether the family would like the Council to do a rosary service. If a Mass will be offered the family should be asked if they would like a resolution of condolence to be presented. Any ceremonial presentation requested should be done only with permission of the clergy. If the deceased Brother is a 4th Degree member, the Grand Knight will notify the Insurance Field Agent and the Faithful Navigator of the Assembly.
