### **Knights for Life News**

The Catholic and pro-life Christian community are not the only ones to recognize the insidious character of the Roe v. Wade decision of 1973 in its effect on the moral fabric of our society. In the minds of many, legality is equated to morality. In fact, the fallacious nature of the decision was recognized immediately by Yale law professor John Hart Ely, who made an early and telling attack on Roe's postulation of the so-called right to abortion. Referring to the court's delineation of the difficulties of undesired pregnancy, he wrote: "All of this is true and ought to be taken very seriously. But it has nothing to do with privacy in the Bill of Rights sense or any other the Constitution suggests... What is unusual about Roe is that the liberty involved is accorded ... a protection more stringent, I think it is fair to say, than that the present Court accords the freedom of the press explicitly guaranteed by the First

Amendment. What is frightening about Roe is that this super-protected right is not inferable from the language of the Constitution, the framers' thinking respecting the specific problem in issue, any general value derivable from the provisions they included, or the nation's governmental structure. Nor is it explainable in terms of the unusual political impotence of the group judicially protected vis a vis the interest that legislatively prevailed over it. And that, I believe ... is a charge that can responsibly be leveled at no other decision of the past twenty years." Though different in emphasis, consider Pope John Paul II's clear and compelling words in addressing a false assumption regarding the value and inviolability of human life in Evangelium Vitae.

The introduction to the encyclical reminds us of "the incomparable worth of the human person." Every woman and man is called "to a fullness of life which far exceeds the dimension of

earthly existence because it consists in sharing the very life of God." Aside from the unique qualities that every human being has, including the ability to consciously reflect on existence, the capability of making free choices and above all the possibility of a loving relationship with God, there is the fundamental divine gift — the call to a life that will "reach its full realization in eternity" (2.1).

At the death of a Brother Knight, notify the Grand Knight or the next in charge, who will then contact the family and offer sympathy and help from the Council. The Council member contacting the family should ask whether a wake will be held and if so. whether the family would like the Council to do a rosary service. If a Mass will be offered the family should be asked if they would like a resolution of condolence to be presented. Any ceremonial presentation requested should be done only with permission of the clergy. If the deceased Brother is a 4th Degree member, the Grand Knight will notify the Insurance Field Agent and the Faithful Navigator of the Assembly.
